# Planning for the Future

As we know the Bowling Club took the initiative some years ago in an effort to lease the pavilion and bowling green from the council. The council wished the Tennis Club to be involved in the negotiations and plans were drawn up to redevelop the pavilion to suit both clubs. Since the summer, however, the Bowling Club has made it clear that it does not want to be involved with the lease of the tennis courts.

A meeting was held on the 23<sup>rd</sup> July attended by Steve Welsh, Community Leisure Team Leader, Councillor Paul Melling, Aenea, Martin and Alex. It was agreed if the Tennis Club leased the courts from the council, the council was responsible for handing over the courts in first-class condition. After an inspection of the courts Steve Welsh undertook to see to making good the boundary fence, installation of CTV, and refurbishing the playing surface.

A further meeting was held on February 4<sup>th</sup> 2010 attended by the same parties. Steve Welsh presented us with two estimates for upgrading the surface of the courts. It was suggested that there may be some financial assistance from the council but this could not be promised at present. A considerable amount of money would have to come from grants and club funds. Paul melling made it clear that he is ambitious for the club and he is very keen to see top class tennis facilities in Portlethen.

After another inspection of the courts Steve Welsh agreed that the fence had not been fixed and that he will see to it. He also mentioned the value of CTV but made no promises about its installation.

The new committee will have to decide on the best way forward.
